The Pastor is the happy recipient of a beautiful silk Geneva pulpit gown, which was a gift from the Ladies' Aid Society, upon the occasion of his birthday. Again a sincere "thank you," Ladies' Aiders. Never had dreamed of being the possessor of such a fine gown, or of ever feeling so well dressed in the pulpit. We hope we will be permitted to wear it to the limit of its usefulness in the great service for which it was made and given.

Again our Church Council meetings have been turned to solemn quietude by the sudden departure from this life of a faithful and beloved member. Just a year and a month ago we were called to a halt by the crashing news of the tragic accidental death of Mr. Metzger, and now Mr. George J. Bien, Sr., has been called home. His going, too, was without warning to the majority of the Council members. He was with us with his usual interest for Kingdom enterprise at our regular monthly meeting on the evening of May 4th.

----- The hour grew late, some of the members had to leave to attend to other duties, but Mr. Bien stayed. It was eleven o'clock when he stood with the pastor at the door expressing his concern about his little granddaughter, who was ill at the time. Shortly after midnight, perhaps before he had fallen asleep, he was overcome with violent chills, which were the forewarning of that much dreaded sickness, pneumonia. Within twenty-four hours he was made as comfortable as possible in the hospital, but the best of medical skill and nurse's care could not prevent the inevitable. He passed away on Sunday evening, May 10th, in the presence of his loved ones. He had reached the age of 57 years, 11 months and 7 days.

Mr. Bien was deeply conscientious; a man of unselfish spirit and of a kindly affectionate disposition. These traits were not only evidenced in his work with the Church Council, but also at home and among his fellowmen where one met him in life's general run. At our meetings the church was his first and paramount concern. When he spoke, his words came slowly and gave evidence of the fact that he had pondered over the matter in all sincerity. He was decidedly unselfish

and it just came natural for him to want every man to be successful and happy. It was important to him to show kindness to all persons, and he was grateful for every kindness shown him by others. This gratitude he even expressed with a faint smile on that Sunday morning when members of the Church Council, in brotherly love, brought flowers to his bedside. While his Christian faith had often been sorely tried, he yet remained steadfast in his belief that what the heavenly Father does is done in love and it must be right.

He has now joined the church triumphant. May his bereaved wife, children and relatives all be abundantly and abidingly sustained by the hand of Jesus, the healer of every bleeding heart.

Our Improvement Fund Campaign is a thing of the past, but it is a pleasant memory, and the ultimate results of this united effort will bring many a blessing to us and our posterity.

Words could never adequately express our full appreciation for the response of our members and friends to the final Crusade appeal. Thus far the sum of \$44,000 has been raised in cash and subscriptions. Our goal was \$50,000, but when we consider that so many of our people are out of employment, we have done well to raise this much. There are still some members to be solicited and others have asked for pledge cards and are thinking the matter over. When all these pledges have come in we may yet expect to reach the goal.

The Pastor wishes to thank the congregation and the committee for having engaged the services of Rev. J. E. Hummon, one of the staff of campaign directors of the Church Building Campaigns Bureau of the Presbyterian Home Missions Council in Philadelphia. We could never have undertaken the task alone. Dr. Hummon worked among us for four weeks, quietly and graciously, but all the while effectively. Yet all his efforts would have been in vain had he not had the helpful co-operation of that great corps of willing workers from our own ranks. Once more our sincerest thanks to each and every one of you.

The cost of the campaign itself was reasonable enough. When, on the evening of last August 10th, the congregation gave the committee authority to engage a campaign director, it was understood that to raise \$50,000 would cost \$1,000, or \$900 to raise \$40,000. This was considered a very reasonable figure. However, when the director finished his work in our midst we were asked to pay a fee of only \$850. This sum was paid direct to the Home Missions Council, since the director works on a salary basis under that Council. Of course, there was an extra outlay of \$164.35 for printing during the campaign, also a mailing item each week which totaled \$56.80, plus \$63.60, the total cost of entertainment for the Director. Yet, with these items taken into account, everyone

will surely agree that it was money well invested.

At the last meeting of the committee, held at the home of Chairman George P. Mueller, it was decided to invite the architect to attend the next meeting, which will be held on June 3rd, at the home of the secretary, Mr. George F. Schumann.

A very effective bookkeeping system has been inaugurated to record the payments of pledges. Whether we pay by the week or by the month, Miss Becker records them all promptly, so that at a moment's notice Mr. Charles Getz, financial secretary, or Mr. Adam Trautner, treasurer, can enlighten any member who may wish to know his or her standing with regard to the amount of balance due, etc. They report a total of \$8,407.57 cash thus far received into the Building Fund.

Let us maintain the forward look for our beloved United Church. Let us be loyal in service and constant in prayer, for every sacrifice we make for the Master, small or great, if it is our best, will be divinely blessed.

We are the recipients of a splendid Estey folding organ from Mr. Charles Engnoth. Just the thing for Twilight Services. Also an excellent piano from Mr. and Mrs. Frank Deppish. The Sunday School will put it to use in a good cause. Thank you again, good folks.
