This will confirm my prior verbal advices to you when I informed you of the willingness of the United Evangelical Church (formerly known as German United Evangelical Church) to acquiesce in the settlement, as proposed by you, in connection with the claim of Mrs. Amanda A. Walker against the captioned estate.

You are now advised that the Church Council of the United Evangelical Church, by a formal resolution passed at its meeting held on February 3, 1959, approved the payment by you, as executor, of the claim of Mrs. Amanda A. Walker, in the amount of \$1,131.61. The resolution also approved the payment by you as executor, out of the assets of the estate, the debts of the decedent together with the funeral expenses and costs of administration.
