Again it is time to report to the congregations on the progress of our New Church Building Fund. This we can do with real joy and gratitude to God, for the response has been most heartening.

The total amount subscribed has now grown to \$1,196,400 with \$505,600 already paid. Much of this comes from congregations facing difficult problems of their own, yet willing to ask their members to contribute to this nation-wide program of church extension. Additional memorial and special gifts are still being received, indicating the personal appeal of this movement. Many, many thanks to all who are helping us so generously.

To the 10 new churches started in 1951 have been added 12 new fields in 1952, with at least 10 projected for 1953. These are located in 22 different synods. The needs are greatly pressing our available resources. Already \$334,000 have been invested in new fields, with \$105,000 more, definitely earmarked.

To check our records and to encourage payments, we would like to render this account, as of Feb. 20, 1953.
