

Report of the Work of
Company B.

United Boys Brigade of America
German United Evangelical Church.

We started our year with an average attendance of about 25 boys. During the year we have been successful in bringing our membership up to about 48 boys.

Our main objective is to advance Christ's Kingdom in the lives of these boys. Our methods are as follows:

1. The promotion of habits of obedience and discipline by the use of military drill
2. The promotion of reverence by a study of the Bible at the opening of each drill night.
3. The promotion of good clean living and self-reliance by our numerous encampments.

During the year our company has taken part in 4 church services as a group combined with the other companies of the Battalion unit. The attendance at these services consisted of about 700 boys.

We held two parents night entertainments at which time a very enjoyable evening

was provided for the benefit of the Boy's Parents and to give them a better insight into our work.

We conducted a first aid station at the annual church picnic with some experienced first aiders on hand at all times to take care of any accident that may arise. In our company about one half of the boys hold both first aid medals from the National Unit and Red Cross cards given by the National Red Cross for passing prescribed tests.

Our treasury balance at the present time consists of \$87.31 regular treasury and \$20.00 building fund treasury.

We have at the present time uniforms for every member of the company which are supplied at no cost to the Boy's.

Our regular dues is 10 cents per member per week, but due to present conditions our weekly dues averages about 1.75. Each boy paying what he can and if it is impossible for him to pay dues he has the same privileges as any paying member.

We have different types of games in which the boys may indulge each Friday evening before drill.

In July we held our annual encampment which was attended by 29 boys. Nine of these boys could not pay but funds were provided by the company and some generous outside contributors so that they ^(the boys) could go with the rest of the company. It is our policy that each and every boy that wants to go to camp can go whether he can pay or not and he receives the exact same treatment as any other boy. No one but myself is familiar with the names of the boys that cannot pay.

Our motto is to help United Church and I would like for the Board or the Pastor to feel free to call upon us at any time.
