REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

ENVELOPE - Mr. Jones reported the envelopes for 1962 have been ordered.

MUSIC - Mr. Fritze reported that the idea of purchasing hats for the choir has been tabled.

FELLOWSHIP - Mr. Mueller and Mr. Hammerbacher are happy to report that the Easter Communion Services were handled in a very orderly fashion.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION - Pastor Lehmann stated that the adult Confirmation Class will begin April 12th. Pastor Lehmann also stated that there were 37 Confirmands to receive membership to the Church in 1961.

PROPERTY - 1) Mr. Hammerbacher stated that umbrella stands have been purchased and placed in the narthex. 2) Mr. Lou Mueller is to purchase masonite to repair tables in Friendship Hall. 3) Mr. Mueller also is to check the 8th pew in Church as it is coming loose from the floor. 4) A motion was made by Mr. William Koehler and seconded by Mr. William Bark that the Church let the contract to

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Herman Rossmark to paint eight doors in Church at a cost of \$48.00. 5) Mr. Lou Mueller is to look into the idea of installing a ladder leading to the clock tower. 6) Mr. Geo. Hammerbacher is to check into the purchasing of a new vacuum cleaner.

PULPIT - Mr. William Bark sent a letter to Pastor Hiram Davis on March 13, 1961 with the idea of Pastor Davis visiting with us for the burning of the mortgage on Sunday, April 16th. Mr. Bark did not receive a return message so a long distance call was made by Mr. Bark, and in talking to Pastor Davis he replied he would be with us on April 17th at 7:30 P.M.

On March 27th, Mr. Bark sent a letter to Pastor Wilbert L. Brasch who was recommended by Pastor R. F. Frankenfield. On March 29th he received an answer that Pastor Brasch was not interested at this time. Mr. Bark wrote to Pastor Frankenfeld and stated that perhaps Pastor Brasch needed a little encouragement from him to at least come and visit our Church for some particulars.


