Important Facts

Building first contemplated back in 1946 was to cost \$ 285,000

Present Building under revised plan will cost \$ 400,000

Reasons - 1. Its Fireproof

2. It includes an elevator costing \$ 20,000

3. Cost of labor & Materials are much higher.

4. Its so constructed - to permit the addition of two more floors.

Quota assigned to Potomac Synod on the original plan - - - \$ 98,700

Paid on that quota to date - - - - 63,200

Unpaid Balance - - - 35,500

The Board of Trustees found it necessary to recommend an additional quota of one-half of the original quota. It is their sincere hope that this recommendation will be graciously accepted by the Churches.

If all Churches will do their part and cooperate in this new effort to raise the \$ 205,000 still needed to pay for the new Homewood - the whole matter should shape-up something like this -

Note:- The new quota recommended by the Board totals \$ 108,000

Cash contributions received from the 102 congregations of Potomac Synod for all purposes (building & operative) from Jan. 1st this year to Nov. 1st amounted to only \$ 6,969. Of this amount 8 congregations paid \$ 4,916 and the other 94 congregations paid \$ 2,053.

42 out of the 102 congregations of Synod made no contributions to Homewood thus far this year.

As we see it - this is what the Churches can do and in fact must do, if we are to succeed in our building program.

1. Where there are unpaid quotas - do all you sincerely can to pay them in full during 1951.
2. Accept the additional quota and make an honest effort to meet it in full during 1951.
3. If you have a gift or memorial - try to meet as nearly as possible the present cost of construction.
4. Pay for the "furnishings" of a room - this plan we commend to Individuals, Congregations, and all Church organizations.
5. Support our Annuity Plan.

Harvest Home donations were received from 20 congregations of Synod so far this year.

Items of food, etc., needed at the Home - in your giving it would be very helpful if you would consider these -

Fruit Juice, Dried Fruit, Sugar, - granulated & brown, Shortening, Canned Meat, Canned Milk, Coffee, Onions, Mineral Oil, Dutch Cleanser.
