Dear Fred,

For quite some time the officers of the Sunday School have been thinking about the possibilities of giving a free picnic to all the members of the Sunday School. After appointing a committee to study and work out a plan for this matter, we, at our last regular teachers' meeting, were in favor of giving such a picnic. However, we feel as though this undertaking by the Sunday School alone could not be realized.

As superintendent of Sunday School, I feel that if the church would go along with us in carrying out this plan, I am sure that this plan could be worked successfully.

We have plans and rules drawn up as to who would be eligible. The members must attend Sunday School at least 75% of the fifty-two Sundays a year. There would be a picnic fund set up and one cent per pupil present each Sunday would be placed into this fund. Our average attendance per week is approximately four hundred. This means we would put into our fund each week approximately four dollars (\$4.00). This would net us two hundred eight dollars per year. If the church would match this amount, I feel sure that we would have a successful picnic. We would base our figures on the period from July 1st to June 30th.

Enclosed you will find a report on this past year's picnic. Had this been a free picnic, this would have cost an additional seventy-one dollars and seventy-five cents (\$71.75). At the most if all members were to go to the picnic, this would mean six hundred fifty (650) members at twenty cents (.20) ground fee and ten extra buses. (\$130.00 plus \$290.00 or \$420.00).

Please let us have an early written reply on this matter. I would appreciate whatever consideration you may give this plan.
