Call to Confession and Confession of Sin: Pastor: Jesus told the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector for those like us who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and yet despised others. The one who acknowledged himself a sinner and asked for God's mercy was the one who returned to his house truly justified.

People: We come together, not to point at the sins of others, but to recognize and ask forgiveness for our own sins. We experience this event of humility in our personal lives and also in our life together as a congregation. Like for the tax collector, this is a good experience for us.

Pastor: It is also good for us that our worship includes the opportunity to experience how God's mercy transforms us. We share together God's good news of forgiveness in Jesus Christ. The power of His cross and resurrection makes it possible for us to become different than our natural selves.

People: We seek that power to change from what we are to what God would have us become. We need to stop injuring each other and outsiders by our envy, jealousy, and hate. Pastor: Therefore, let us confess our sins and ask God's forgiveness.

All: We join in humility now as we are conscious of both our individual and our corporate

sins. As weakened souls we seek the strength of Thy forgiveness, O God. Pardon us of our wrong doing and our wrong thinking. Remove from us our separation from Thee and from each other. Hear our requests for mercy and grant us the assistance we need to become better in the future. For we ask to be included within Christ's victory over the sinfulness of the whole world and pray in His Name.


